Thanksgiving: The best day of the year.

Hard to argue with that. Since 1619 an annual Thanksgiving Holiday tradition was first documented in what is now known as the Commonwealth of Virginia. On December 4, 1619, 38 English settlers arrived aboard the ship Margaret. The landing was met with a religious celebration which was unofficially the first Thanksgiving.

Many iterations and celebrations followed for decades, with several different dates celebrating what we now call Thanksgiving. Some historians differ on the creation and evolution of this great holiday, but most agree that in 1863 President Abraham Lincoln declared Thanksgiving a National Holiday, to be observed on the final Thursday in November. In October 1939 President Franklin D. Roosevelt made a slight change, moving the date to the next to last Thursday of November. This was done to add more shopping days prior to Christmas between the holidays to help the economy. FDR then made it a more permanent date in late December 1941, declaring the 4th Thursday of November as the official Thanksgiving Day, which continues to be observed.

The bottom line is that the 4th Thursday in November is one that many of us circle on January 1st when we check out our new calendar and note important dates for the year. Birthdays, anniversaries, and Thanksgiving are the likely candidates to be circled first.

And this year, November 27 is the day. The best day of the year? My answer is yes. HAPPY THANKGIVING!

### The Clark Family Bringing The Community Together With A Shared Passion

Jen and Steve Clark kept wondering if the storefront on Main Street that sat vacant for more than 10 years would ever come to life again.

The 3,000-square-foot space last housed a CVS Pharmacy, and it bothered Jen that the vacancy was in such a prominent part of town. "I remember going by and thinking that whatever goes in there should have broad and diverse appeal," she said. "I certainly didn't think we'd be the ones who would eventually be moving in."

The prospect of opening a business was gently planted when the founders of BD Provisions opened a store in Newtown in 2018. The zero-waste company specializes in selling quality bulk foods, coffees and other items by weight. Jen loved the concept and any time she was passing through Newtown she would stop at the store. She also followed the company on social media. Then in 2019 a franchise opportunity opened up.

"Over the years I felt I wanted to start something of my own; Oh I've had some hair brain ideas over time, but this was different," said Jen, who graduated from New Milford High School. "I had a good feeling about this. I liked the concept of buying only what you need, so I presented the idea to Steve. He said let's find out some more information, so we did our homework."



In December 2020, the Clarks realized their dream and opened up their franchise in that same empty storefront that had sat idle for so long.

The business sells 15 different types of freshly roasted coffee beans that can be ground on site, along with a host of other bulk offerings such as nuts, dried fruit, candies, dried beans and flours that are stored in seemingly endless rows of fiberglass drums.

"Steve roasts every batch of beans that goes into a bin," Jen said. His efforts were rewarded this year when Connecticut Magazine named the store Best Coffee Roaster in Litchfield County. That individual touch goes right along with BD Provision's corporate mission statement - "Nourishing the community one scoop at a time."

Customers can also bring in their own standard Ball jars, which are placed in a receptacle and in turn the customer is given a sanitized jar. All food items, including pasta, cereals and candies such as dark chocolates, licorice and gummi bears, are weighed as customers pay by the pound. The most popular items are candies, chocolates and snacks.

"I absolutely enjoy when people come in and see a candy that they haven't seen since childhood," Jen said. "We do offer something for every generation."





This isn't the only time the Clarks brought something back to life. Steve, who graduated from Western Connecticut State University with a major in English and a minor in Music, purchased a house on Fort Hill Road in 2000 that was built in 1915 and was in a state of disrepair. Steve said the family who owned it was hoping whoever bought it would bring it back to life. After much sweat the house was completely refurbished. "It's more than just a house for us," Jen said. "We enjoy breathing new life into old things. That house is part of that story."

The house is also home for the Clark's two children, Wesley, 14 and Natalie 12. Over the years Steve, who was involved in technology for the Brookfield and Sherman school districts, has coached both children in soccer through Park and Recreation leagues. Both Wesley and Natalie are second-degree black belts in Tae Kwan Do and Wesley is also a member of the New Milford High School band.

Jen's knowledge of French and France - where she spent a semester as a college sophomore - came in handy earlier this year when the whole family traveled to that country.

The Clarks, however, do enjoy life in New Milford because of its natural beauty, cultural venues and the opportunities to meet many different types of people.

"Steve and I have a passion for bringing the community together. We all eat food, so we share that in common," Jen said. "I just love seeing reunions inside and outside the store. Seeing people connecting with each other."

# The Right Time For The First Orthodontic Evaluation Is Age 7

The recommended time for a child's first orthodontic visit is age 7. At first glance, that statement might seem a bit surprising, but there are many reasons that the American Association of Orthodontists recommends a first check-up at a young age. Sometimes, there are situations where early orthodontic treatment may help parents to avoid

more costly, and often more invasive, treatment for their child in the future.

Palatal expansion is a common early phase I orthodontic treatment. It can be used for a variety of reasons. Some children have anterior crossbites, which is when an upper front tooth bites incorrectly, inside the lower teeth. Uncorrected anterior crossbites can lead to gum tissue recession and expensive gum tissue surgeries. Palatal expansion can also correct crowding of the teeth. In some cases of significant crowding, unerupted permanent teeth can become impacted. When this occurs, children are much likely to need full braces later, often with extractions of permanent teeth or the need to see the oral surgeon for expensive procedures to help bring down the impacted tooth (this is called a surgical exposure procedure). It is very common to have a narrow palate, and in some cases, the upper jaw can be so narrow that the upper teeth sit inside the lower teeth, which is incorrect. If this occurs, young children usually have to swing their jaw to one side to create a more comfortable bite. Over time, this can lead to one side of the lower jaw "growing longer" than the other, which creates an asymmetric face.

Palatal expansion works the best when the child is very young, as it places gentle pressure on the growth plate or suture located on the roof of the mouth, underneath the gums (you can feel this suture on the roof of your mouth with your tongue- in children, this suture is open and can be gently stretched further with a palatal expander- in adults, this requires jaw surgery).

Children with underbites should be seen at a very young age, as it has been shown that early treatment (usually with a palate expander and a removable headgear, to be worn only at home) is as effective as future jaw surgery as an adult. It is an easy decision for parents to choose a simple early orthodontic treatment that can be as effective as a future expensive and invasive jaw surgery procedure. Luckily, only 5% of children have underbites, but it should be treated very early when it is discovered.

Children with too much overbite (overbite means that the upper front teeth overlap the lower teeth by far too much) often benefit from wearing a simple removable anterior bite plate. This is a special type of removable upper retainer that holds the front teeth at the correct overlap and allows the molars and bicuspids to begin growing at a faster rate until they also bite at the correct overbite. It is a simple, relatively inexpensive appliance and sturdy enough that it can be worn during school hours (even during lunch and snacks, to prevent breakage or loss) that can lead to a

very significant improvement in vertical overbites. Decreasing overbite helps to decrease wear (and chipping) of the front teeth and can make future braces (or Invisalign) treatments shorter, at a fairly low cost.

Many parents ask if they should wait to see the orthodontist until their dentist recommends it. Children should certainly see the orthodontist when their dentist recommends it, but there is no reason to wait. If parents notice something about their child's teeth or jaws that is a concern to them, it is also a concern to me. I am happy to examine a child, and either allay parents' fears or discuss something that might require a little intervention. For this reason, I do not charge a fee for an initial consultation, as I would rather discover an issue and treat it at the correct time rather than delay for financial reasons. There may be no reason to begin orthodontic treatment. If so, I generally like to follow up with the child on an annual basis, to make sure that everything progresses properly until all the permanent teeth erupt (usually at age 12 or 13).

Not all early consultation visits result in early treatment, but if it's needed, you'll be in the right place to begin.

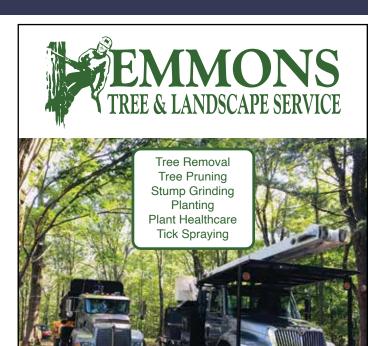

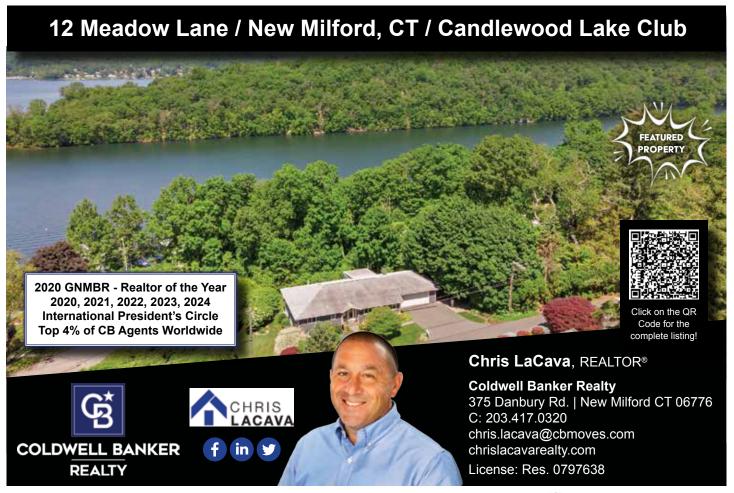

### On The New Milford Green... with with Jim Delancy And The Stuart M3A1 Tank

It is a typical daily scene on The New Milford Green. Children climbing on what is affectionately known as "The Tank" with their parents watching intently. This wonderful scene has been occurring since just after World War II when the Stuart M3A1 made its way to New Milford and found its final resting place on The Green.

Just steps away from the Bandstand, The Tank is more than a symbol of our military with the pride our community holds dear. It is a memorial to those who served. American Legion Commander and proud veteran, Jim Delancy takes special delight when the Stuart M3A1 is mentioned. Possibly the most knowledgeable person in the area on the subject, Commander Delancy gave New Milford Living even more insight on the history and information of The Tank.

Commander Delancy, a Vietnam Veteran who served as and E5 Staff Sergeant in the Air Force has also served as Commander of the New Milford Veterans of Foreign War (VFW) and was the Connecticut State Commander of the VFW from 2016-2019. He is now Commander of New Milford American Legion Post 31. His continued service has been a valuable asset to our community, including the topic of one of New Milford's most important assets... The Tank.

As the story goes, Charles Robertson, President of the Robertson Bleachery in New Milford housed The Tank in a warehouse space on West Street after being shipped to New Milford. The Tank was part of the 1948 Memorial Day Parade, and was then permanently parked on The New Milford Green, a very logical choice. A community meeting place became a local landmark, and even a tourist attraction. And since World War II was just a couple of years removed, the impact was dramatic. And yes, children quickly took to turning this into their own personal playground.

Based on Commander Delancy's expertise, the Stuart M3A1's were built by the American Car and Foundry Company (ACF) in both Berwick, PA and St Charles, MO at a cost of approximately \$33,000. The M3A1's were built in 1941-42. These "Light Tanks" were used in World War II primarily in North Africa and the Philippines. The British soldiers called the M3A1 "Honeys" due

to their smooth ride. The Stuarts were named after J.E.B. Stuart, a Confederate Civil War General. In the later years of WWII these tanks were used for reconnaissance and screening.

The M3A1 was operated by a 4-man crew: a commander, a gunner, a driver, and an assistant driver. Reaching a speed of 36 mph with a gas tank of 89 gallons and a range of 100 miles, the M3A1 got a whopping 1.12 mpg. The weaponry on this light tank was a 37mm M5 Gun (147 rounds), and five 30.06 Browning Machine Guns (estimated 10,000 rounds), which varied from tank to tank.

While Stuart Light Tanks were made by ACF, the larger M5 variants were made by General Motors.

The M3A1 on The Green, at one time allowed for those children to not only climb on top but also explore inside. Commander Delancy recalled, "We used to be able to crawl inside the tank, but it was closed for safety reasons after a young boy got stuck."

In 2020, the Town of New Milford began a long overdue refurbishing of "The Tank" and the result was that it looked as though it just rolled off the factory floor. Money was raised with private donations, and the entire project was volunteer. This is another point of pride for our town, and when folks say "I'll meet you on The Green" it means by that amazing looking tank that shines like new.



Commander Delancy has lived in New Milford his entire life and can always remember "The Tank" and has never taken it for granted. "This tank is a part of New Milford history and to this day children from all around still play or sit on the tank making memories. If I could go back in time, I would still climb on the tank. And with Veteran's Day this month, The Tank's symbolism is even greater."

Growing up in an Italian Family I was surrounded by the aromas of amazing dishes being prepared by my Rabbits, chickens, and goats were all bought from local farms and prepared in our home, with the backyard, and what couldn't be grown there was

So, from a very young age I learned how to hone my craft. I loved to learn from them and eventually put my own twist on things. The recipe I'm going to share with you is one of my Nonna Lucia's favorites. Hope you enjoy it.

#### PACHERI AL BOSCO

To begin, let me start by saying fresh and local is always better. Luckily for us, we have plenty of grocers to choose from if you can't.

Mother and Nonna. Everything was made from scratch. We didn't buy pasta from a store; we made it. Sausages were made by my Father and Nonno. care. Not to mention the wine that came out of my Father's cold room. Vegetables were grown in bought from another local farm and canned for yearround use.

for a few more minutes, add a dash of salt and pepper

Start by boiling a large pot of well salted water. Pacheri is a large, smooth Rigatoni, that you'll cook until al dente.

In the meantime heat a large saucepan over medium high heat. Add to that extra virgin olive oil, sausage, removed from skins, sliced wild mushrooms, cherry peppers, diced tomatoes, garlic and sautee for a few minutes. When that is coming together you'll add a splash of dry white wine, and a bit of chicken stock, but not too much because we don't want soup. Sautee

and a handful of baby arugula. Finish by tossing the cooked pasta into the large sautee pan and mix well, with a bit of the pasta water. To serve, grab your favorite bowl, add the pasta dish and finish with a sprinkle of Parmesan, and bit of fresh parsley.

- 3 tbs. extra virgin olive oil
- 1lb Pacheri or Rigatoni
- 1/2 lb. good sausage (sweet or spicy) we use spicy
- 3 good quality plum tomatoes
- 7 baby bella or mixed variety of mushrooms
- 4 pickled cherry peppers sliced
- 4 cloves chopped garlic
- 1/2 cup white wine
- 1/2 cup chicken stock
- 1 1/2 cups arugula
- 1/4 cup parmesan
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Fresh parsley or basis to finish (optional) but I like both.

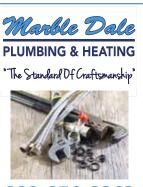
My career began as a walk on at Western

### Melomakarona

Every Holiday Season, as the scent of cinnamon, orange zest, and cloves drift from my kitchen, I'm transported back to my childhood and the voice of my Giagia (grandmother). For my family, no holiday is complete without Melomakarona, the beloved Greek honey cookies that have become a symbol of love and tradition. I come from a family of Greek roots, specifically, a connection to the Island of Crete, where my Giagia was born.

Melomakarona are spiced syrup-soaked cookies traditionally made during the Christmas season in Greece. They're rich with flavors of orange zest, cinnamon cloves, and soaked in a luscious honey syrup, then topped with crushed walnuts. The word itself has ancient roots, blending Mali, honey, and Makaria, a type of bread offered at funerals meant to bless the dead. Over time, the cookie evolved into something joyous, the sweet reminder of life celebration and spiritual richness.

My Giagia established many Greek traditions in our family, from spanakopita to dolmathes; her food was rich in tradition and love. My own mother, who was German by origin, carried on the Greek spirit in our family.

Fast forward to 1998, when I reestablished this tradition with my own daughter, Ari. A field trip to Ellis Island followed by a food fair at Northville Elementary School inspired us. Ari was in fifth grade and Mrs. Fogel was her teacher. Fond memories. We started baking them together and have continued the tradition many years later.

Most recently, my husband, Dan, and I traveled to Greece. The pastries resonated with my earliest memories of love and happiness. As a Giagia now myself, I have already started sharing these traditions with my grandchildren, Hannah and Peter, so that these recipes of love and family are never lost.

#### **MELOMAKARONA**

Makes 45-50 Cookies

#### **INGREDIENTS**

#### Dough

- 1 ½ cups cooking oil
- 1 ½ cups soft butter or margarine
- 1 cup sugar
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup orange juice
- 4 tbsp brandy
- 4 tbsp water
- 1 cup farina
- 7 cups flour
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1 ½ cups ground walnuts
- 1 tsp orange zest

### Syrup

- 1 ½ cups honey
- 1 ½ cups sugar
- 1 ½ cups water
- Peel from 1 orange
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp cloves

#### Dough

- 1. Beat oil, butter, sugar, orange juice, brandy & water together (2-3 minutes)
- 2. Sift ½ of flour with baking powder and soda
- 3. Gradually add to mix above
- 4. Gradually mix rest of flour and farina: add orange zest
- Shape (oval or round) and bake on ungreased cookie sheet at 350: 25 minutes

#### Syrup

- 1. Boil all ingredients together
- 2. Remove foam
- 3. Simmer about 5 minutes

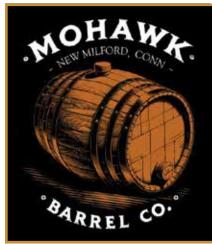
#### Final Steps

- 1. Arrange Melomakarona in deep baking pan
- 2. Pour hot syrup on cool Melomakarona
- 3. Turn every 15 minutes until cookies are well moist
- 4. Remove from syrup to cookie sheet
- 5. Sprinkle top generously with walnuts
- 6. Place in baking cups or serve as they are
